

# A Message From Our Rabbi



A little girl comes home from school, eager to show her mother a drawing. Her mother is washing dishes. "Mommy, guess what?" she squeals, waving the drawing. Without looking up, her mother responds, "What?" "Guess what?" repeats the little girl. Again the mother asks, "What?" "Mommy, you're not listening." Still not shifting her focus from the dishes, she says, "Yes sweetie, I am." "But Mommy, you're not listening with your eyes."

It seems, in today's climate, we are failing in the art of listening. We are so engrossed in our daily lives, so head-down and task-oriented, so divided, that we not only forget to listen with our eyes, we fail to open our ears. Last month we spent time learning from various Torah portions the value of truly seeing and hearing. We saw it with Korach's rebellion and the possible underlying issue that was at hand. We experienced it again with Bilaam as he gazed upon the tents of Jacob and "truly saw." And we saw it once more in the stories of Pinchas and Zelophechad's daughters and how their actions demonstrated the necessity of "seeing" and "hearing" with eyes and ears of truth. Of course, this idea can be found in the most famous of all Jewish prayers, the Shema. We translate it as "hear." Yet its root and meaning is not "to hear," rather the higher value, the greater mitzvah — we are commanded to listen.

Hearing is the easy part. Hearing simply happens. Listening and seeing, however, is a conscious choice. Listening requires concentration and leads to understanding. Listening requires not only your ears, but your eyes, your heart, your mind — indeed L'shma nefesh we must listen with our soul, our complete being. Most people are not "hard of hearing," rather they are "hard of listening." Acknowledging another human being is not about giving advice; it is about giving attention. People's words are their most personal creations, coming straight from their minds and going directly into the listener's ears, yearning to find a home in our heart. When one truly listens, he or she gives more than can be imagined, for the listener holds sacred a piece of the speaker's soul. What an honor it is to listen!

Rabbi Harold Kushner stated, "When we call out to God in our distress, God answers us by sending us people. Any path is easier to travel when you have somebody's hand to hold." There is deep pain in our world right now and it is the pain of divisiveness, isolation and loneliness. We can soften some of that pain. We can put our phone down; turn off the 24-hour news cycle. Or just simply stop what we are doing and listen to our friend or loved one with intention and empathy.

Let's return to that mother in her kitchen with her daughter. The mother was now listening to her daughter. She put down her dishes and lifted up her eyes, she leaned down, got close to see the creation in the child's hand. The mother focused on her words, she listened with her eyes and her ears and her heart and her soul whispered, "Hineini — here I am!"

Most important, whether you are a member, guest, or friend, you must register in advance, to be admitted into the building. It is sad that we must take these measures, however, we must be diligent and never put the safety and wellbeing of our attendees at risk. As Rosh Hashanah brings 5784 to an end and welcomes 5785, we cannot forget the atrocities of October 7th, but continue to look to the future by honoring LaDor va Dor, from generation to generation. It is our heritage to move forward and celebrate Judaism but to also remember those who have passed. Every year, we celebrate the lives of those who we have lost by remembering them during our Yizkor Service. Yizkor follows our Yom Kippur morning service. As part of Yizkor, we read the names of all being remembered, and to further honor our lost loved ones, the temple prints a Yizkor - Book of Remembrance. This book is handed out to all attendees of our Yizkor service prior to its start. For those of you who wish to have the names of your loved ones and friends in our Book of Remembrance, simply fill out the appropriate form which may be found on our website www.bethel-fl.org. under the "Religious Life / Yizkor - Book of Remembrance" menu.

For those of you interested in learning, or improving your skills in reading Hebrew, we are considering offering a series of classes. Keep you eyes open in your emails and other temple communications for a very short survey to identify interest.

As a reminder, many people in Manatee County need our help getting food. 

### Ask the Rabbi

### **Question:**

What exactly is the holiday of Tisha B'Av?

### **Answer:**

Tisha B'Av literally means the 9th day of the month of Av. It is regarded as the saddest day in the Jewish calendar, a day in which numerous tragedies in Jewish history occurred. Some of the tragedies include:

- The spies returned from the Promised Land with frightening reports, and the Israelites balked at the prospect of entering the land. G-d decreed that they would therefore wander in the desert for 40 years.
- Both Holy Temples in Jerusalem were destroyed on this date. The First Temple was burned by the Babylonians and the Second Temple fell to the Romans.
- The Bar Kochba revolt against the Romans ended in defeat: The Jews of Betar were butchered and the Temple Mount was plowed one year later on the same date.
- ► The 1290 expulsion of England's Jews
- The 1492 banishment of all Jews from Spain.





# Friday Aug. 16th & Saturday, Aug. 17th, 2024

On Tisha B'Av (the 9th day in the Hebrew month of Av) we remember the destruction of the Temples in Jerusalem and other calamities in our history. It is a national day of mourning for the Jewish people. Just a few days later on Tu'B Av (the 15th day in the Hebrew month of Av) the tide turns.

Tu' B Av can be traced back to the grape harvest, when single women would dress in white and dance in the light of the full moon in vineyards to signal their status as being eligible for marriage. Today, Tu B'Av is making a comeback in Israel, where it's celebrated as a modern Jewish Valentine's Day with ancient roots.




