My Message - By Reb Tuviah



September is here and with it comes the High Holidays of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. The beginning of a new year is filled with mixed emotions. In looking back on the previous year we focus on our failures, missed opportunities and the precious moments that slipped by. At the same time, the Yamim Noraim (High Holy Days) provide us with a new year full of hope and renewal.

The rituals and symbols of Rosh Hashanah wonderfully capture and express these mixed feelings. The shofar blasts cry out for the year gone by. The shofar urges us to wake up, look inside ourselves and to

recognize our habitual shortcomings. By continuing the process of introspection in these final days of the month of Elul, we can recite the prayers of the High Holy Days with a sense of seriousness and urgency. But Rosh Hashanah is more than just somber prayers in a minor key. Gathered as temple family, we dip challah and apples into honey. The sweet honey reminds us of the many pleasures we experienced in the course of the previous year. By reciting special blessings we ask God to grant us a new year of health and happiness.

Yom Kippur lacks the shofar and the festival meal of Rosh Hashanah, but its rituals are no less powerful, its symbols no less evocative. On Yom Kippur many of us dress in white. White reminds us of the purity that we strive to attain throughout our lives. During the course of the day's extended prayers, one symbol is repeated over and over again. As we recite the vidui (confessional), it is customary to stand slightly bowed and to lightly beat our hearts with our fisted right hand. Bent over under the weight of burdens and pain, we express our humility. Admitting that our hearts turned astray, we beat our chest to express the pain we caused ourselves and others.

Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur...two immensely powerful and evocative observances in our Jewish calendar. Albert, Maxx, Cantorial Soloist Miriam Blau and I look forward to bringing new meaning and depth to these most holy days. We have the machzorim (prayerbooks), we have our planned outline, and we have our instruments...but the most important part of all of this is you. It is the energy each one of us contributes to the TBE Sanctuary when gathered together as a temple family that truly creates the high holiday experience.

Nancy and I wish you all a meaningful, insightful and loving high holiday experience. L'Shanah tovah tikatevu v'tichatem; May you be inscribed and sealed for a good year.

Members and non-members can memorialize their loved ones by placing their names in our 2023/5784 Yizkor Book of Remembrance. The Book of Remembrance will be distributed just before our Yizkor service begins. If you want a loved one's name listed, you can complete the form sent via US Mail the first week of August or online by clicking here. The deadline to complete your Yizkor Book of Remembrance requests is September 14th.

Our growth over that past year has been unprecedented, and I am happy to report that FOUR new members have joined Temple Beth El since we published our last newsletter only a month ago.





From Our Temple Treasurer

Two Ways to Make a Tax-Free Contributions to Temple Beth El

Starting in 2019 the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act increased the standard Federal income tax deduction such that more than 90 percent of taxpayers now take the standard deduction. The 2022 standard deduction is \$13,850 for single filers and \$27,700 for those filing married filing jointly. Add \$1500 for singles and \$3000 for married filing jointly for those over sixty-five.

That means your contributions to the Temple along with major medical and other deductible expenses would have to exceed these amounts to have an impact on your tax bill.

However, there are at least two ways to make a significant contribution to the Temple and save money on your taxes:

- 1. Set up a Charitable Remainder Trust with the Temple as the charitable beneficiary.
- 2. For those over the age of seventy-two with a traditional IRA, pay the required minimum distribution (RMD) directly from the IRA to the Temple.

The Charitable Remainder Trust must be set up by an attorney. It is an irrevocable trust. The donor transfers cash or assets to the trust. In addition to a qualified charity (such as the Temple) there must be one or more living individuals who will receive income from the trust for a specific number of years or for life. At the end of the term the remainder of the trust passes to the charitable organization.

Making changes in your RMD distribution is much easier. Simply inform the bank or broker that you want either a fixed amount or a percentage to go to the synagogue. The end of year statement (1099-R) will never show that amount and you can still take the standard deduction.

These paragraphs are for your general information only. It is not tax advice. I urge you to consult with a qualified income tax professional before making any changes.

Tax Planning and High Holiday Giving

If you have appreciated stock in any publicly traded company, you can donate the stock to Temple Beth El. You may be able to deduct the current market value from your 2021 taxable income as a Schedule A deduction without paying capital gains tax. The Temple can then sell the stock and use the funds to continue our good work.

Tax year 2021 appears to be the last year that most taxpayers can take up to a charitable cash contribution to a non-profit organization (such as Temple Beth El) directly from adjusted gross income. This "above the line" deduction is limited to \$300 for taxpayers filing as single, head of household, qualified widow(er)s, and married filing separately. Taxpayers filing joint returns are limited to \$600.

As in all things tax-related, there are exceptions and additional rules. Each person's situation is unique. Please check with your tax preparer to be sure. These are general suggestions only based on publicly available information.

An Easy Way to Donate to TBE

Most of use have a dish where we collect coins that fell into our pockets or purses. Please consider donating them to the Temple's "Pushki Fund." One hundred percent of the coins donated will go to the Temple's general fund and help us fund on-going operations. We will acknowledge your donation by letter and, if you itemize deductions, you can use the amount to lower your tax bill. Just put the coins into a sturdy plastic bag along with a note with your name and address. Leave the bag on the Temple's desk in the office the next time you come to services. We'll take it from there.


