# **A Message From Our Temple President**



Dear Members and Friends,

Historically, Temple Beth El holds its Annual Membership Meeting on the fourth Sunday of every April. This meeting is an opportunity for all members to meet our entire Board of Directors, ask questions, review finances from the previous year and the proposed budget for the upcoming year. In addition, they listen to reports from all of our committees. Members also vote on any operating modifications that

were proposed, including our slate of officers, bylaws, and budgeting. The voting cannot be considered official unless the number of members at the meeting meets our

minimum quorum requirement, which is based on 20% of our entire membership. This year, we needed twenty-seven members to have a quorum. Twenty-three members attended the meeting, and with the six mailed-in absentee votes, our quorum was met. Although the vote was considered official, it was disappointing that such a small percentage of our membership attended. Except for the Rabbi, we rely entirely on a handful of volunteers, who work tirelessly to keep our temple going. They prepare our Shabbat services and bulletins, specialized services, the Weekly Wrap, monthly Newsletter, personalized Yahrzeit letters, webpage updates, online forms, and essential communications. This work requires upwards of 100 hours per week. Our current volunteers are stretched beyond their limits, and expecting them to continue at this pace is unreasonable. We will be starting our fiscal year on June 1st, and sadly, we will be without two of our Executive Board members. I want to thank our outgoing VP, Robyn Spirtas, for her undeniable dedication to TBE and her spectacular ability to keep things moving. Her talents will be missed. Also retiring is Treasurer Ira Kramer. He has done an excellent job budgeting and reviewing our finances for the past two years. Thanks to Ira's insight and hard work, he has brought TBE into a position where we can qualify for matching donations from local civic groups, philanthropists, and government agencies. Thank you, Ira, for all you have done. You, too, will be missed on the board.

Since the October 7th attacks in Israel, our Security Committee has been on high alert and, under the leadership of Gary Weinberg, has rewritten how TBE handles security and the overall safety of our members. This was a monumental task, and as of June 1st, Gary, too, will be retiring from that position. Gary built a team of professionals that will be our safety net in these turbulent times. Thank you, Gary, for all your relentless work and heartfelt dedication to TBE.

Finally, due to his intense workload, our Men's Club president, Mitch Mallet, has also resigned. Mitch will always be an active part of TBE, and I wish to thank him for all his efforts and contributions.

# Answer:

Yom HaZikaron is Israel's Memorial Day and Yom HaAtzmaut is Israel's Independence Day. On Yom HaZikaron, Israel remembers and honors military troops who have given their lives in protecting the country. Israel also honors those who were victims of terrorism.



On Yom HaZikaron, Israelis pause to remember. Places of entertainment are closed and two-minute sirens sound throughout the country. People stop their cars and stand in silence.

After a day of mourning, the mood of the entire nation turns to celebration. Yom HaAtzmaut is marked by parties, barbecues, and outdoor concerts. Family and friends gather for parties and visit the country's cultural institutions.

# **Legacy Gift Giving**




